Application for Admission

Apply early

NSCC makes offers of admission to eligible applicants in order of their application completion date in all programs except competitive entry programs, which have specific application deadlines. Applications are considered complete when all application-related documentation is received. Many programs fill quickly each year, so the sooner we receive your complete application, the better your chances of being admitted.

International applicants are encouraged to apply early as a valid study permit is required to study in Canada and a co-op work permit is required to complete your program.

Before you apply

- **Review** your chosen program's admission requirements.
- You can have one active application with up to two choices.
- Your choices will be assessed in order of preference.
- Changing one or both choices requires a new application and fee.
- Homeschooled applicants, applicants with an Individual Program Plan (IPP), mature students and applicants who lack sufficient recognized documentation will require further assessment.
- If you want to be readmitted into a program but didn't complete all credits from first term, you are required to complete a new application.
- If you have not completed high school and are at least 19 years of age, you will be considered a mature student. You may be required to complete courses to meet admission requirements.

About your documentation

- Official transcripts must be received in a sealed envelope or sent directly from the school by email or mail. Faxes are not acceptable. If you graduated from a Nova Scotia public high school in 2012 or later, you can provide your Nova Scotia Student ID Number (PSN) on the last page of this application and we will retrieve your transcript for you.
- Interim transcripts should be submitted if you are currently enrolled in courses/programs required for admission.
- Advanced standing is available if you have significant post-secondary credits that meet the learning outcomes for the first year of a two-year program. To apply for advanced standing, please submit all relevant post-secondary documentation with your application.
- All documentation except official French transcripts from Nova Scotia public high schools must be submitted in English.
- Documents in a language other than English must be translated by a certified translator (indicated with a stamp or seal and signature on the document).
- Applications without supporting documentation will be cancelled after 90 days. Applications to competitive entry programs without supporting documentation will be cancelled after the published application deadline.
- Once you have applied, you will gain access to our application management system, MyNSCC. You can then check your MyNSCC for a list of documents required to complete your application.
- Applicants using international credentials to meet admission requirements may be asked to submit documentation to an NSCC approved credential verification service provider to be evaluated for equivalency.
- All submitted documents are recorded and shredded to protect privacy and will not be returned. If you have any questions, please contact us.

If you change your mind

- Changing your program choices requires a new application and fee.
- A new application cancels your previous application.
- Carry any choice you want to keep from your old application to your new one. This is especially important if you were admitted or waitlisted on your old application.

Additional admission requirements

- Many programs have additional course or admission requirements which are time sensitive to your admission to the College.
